



Choices for Children



Go Green, save your "green" and have fun with your kids!

Does that title sound like a win-win! It is! While the winter holiday season brings good cheer for most people, it also brings a lot more solid waste to the landfill, harm to the environment, and additional debt to the average American family. For many it adds additional stress that just cannot be absorbed into an already tight schedule.

The following is a list of suggestions that will help reduce some of the holiday waste, alleviating some of the stress put on the environment during the holidays, save you some money and allow you some good, quality time with your children. Now isn't that what holiday memories are about?

- 1- Avoid the cost and waste of wrapping paper. Ask for paper sacks when you get your groceries. Cut them, turn them inside out. Have your children decorate them. Take a pine branch and dip in paint. Or use a cookie cut dipped in paint. Or use a cookie cutter to trace a shape on a sponge. Cut out the shape and dip in paint. The result is a one-of-a-kind, sturdy wrapping paper that everyone will love! Need ribbon? No problem. Use fabric scraps or yarn from the thrift store. You could even teach you child how to braid or crochet and use the finished piece as ribbon.
- 2- Reuse those holiday cards. You may have tossed out last years, but save them this year. The kids can cut out the images they like most, hole punch- et voila, a fabulous gift tag! This also works well for those of you who like scrapbooking.
- 3- Make homemade ornaments. Ideas for homemade ornaments abound! One idea, reuse those holiday pie tins- the soft, aluminum ones from the grocery store. Use a cookies cutter as a template and cut out the shape. Use a wooden spoon to swirl patterns over the shape to give it eye appeal. Decorate with sequins, jewels, buttons, yarns- whatever you have around.
- 4- Make your own garland. What a great way to learn about patterning. One cranberry, 2 pieces of popcorn, 1 cranberry, 2 pieces of popcorn. Or use marshmallows which can be easier than popcorn for small children. Also remember construction paper loops and a stapler make great garland!
- 5- Save up those broken pieces of crayons. Place in small muffin tins or holiday shaped muffin pans and bake at 250 degrees until melted.
- 6- Make some fabulous foot soak as a gift. Mix Epson salts, essential oil fragrance, a little food coloring and place in jars (reuse your own from your pantry or pick some up at your local thrift store).

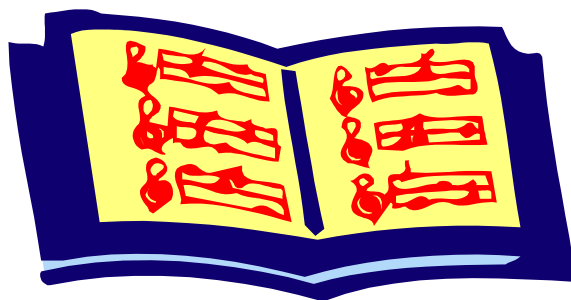

The New Speaking of Sex book- by Meg Hinkling. What your children need to know and when they need to know it.

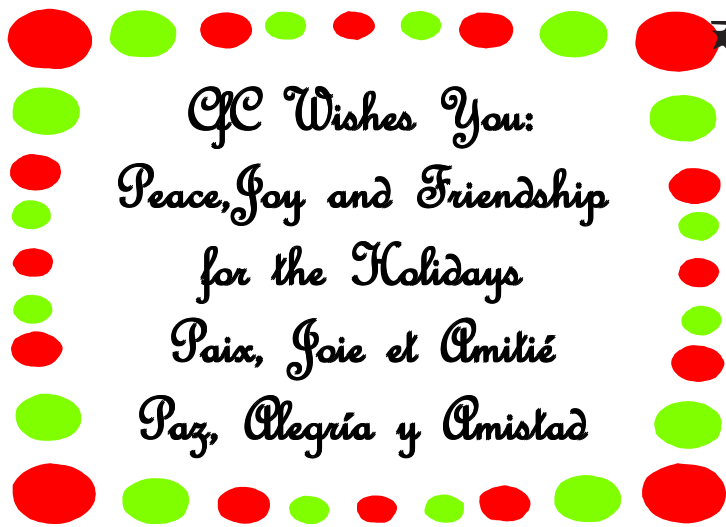
